Do you need help buying groceries for your family?

- Did you know that Pennsylvania's **WIC** (**W**omen, **I**nfants and **C**hildren) program provides free grocery vouchers to low-income women and children?

What food can I buy with WIC vouchers?

- Fruit, vegetables, dairy products (milk, cheese, yogurt), soymilk, eggs, grains (bread, tortillas, rice, pasta, cereal), beans, fish.
- Babies can receive infant formula and baby food.

Who is eligible for WIC?

- Low-income pregnant women, nursing mothers, and children under the age of 5.
- Parents, foster parents and other legal guardians can apply for WIC for children in their care.
- WIC does not require proof of citizenship or immigration status.
- You can receive SNAP (food stamps) and also WIC.

Does WIC go onto my EBT/Access card?

- Not yet. WIC still distributes grocery vouchers. In 2019 Pennsylvania plans to begin using a separate Access card for WIC.

What is WIC's definition of low-income?

- If you or your children receive SNAP (food stamps), MA (Medicaid) or TANF (cash assistance), you are automatically income-eligible for WIC, and you only need to show participation in one of those programs.
- You can still receive WIC even if you don't qualify for those other programs. Your income must be under 185% of the poverty line. The 2018 WIC income guidelines are approximately:

| Household Size | Monthly income limit (approx.) |
|-----------------------|---------------------------------------|
| 1 | \$1,871 |
| 2 | \$2,537 |
| 3 | \$3,203 |
| 4 | \$3,869 |
| Each addt'l person | + \$666 |

- A pregnant person counts as two people for household size.

How do I apply for WIC?

- After you apply online, to be enrolled you will have to go to your local WIC office for an appointment. Philadelphia has neighborhood WIC offices around the city: <http://northwic.org/locations/>
