# Here's what resources are available now:

### Comcast Internet Essentials

Sign up before Jan. 1st 2021, and get 2 free months of service!

- Apply at internetessentials.com or call 1-855-8-INTERNET
- Eligibility: You are eligible if you are eligible for public assistance programs such as the National School Lunch Program, Medicaid, SNAP, SSI, and others.
- Comcast also offers laptops for \$150 to Internet Essentials customers.

### Other Internet Options - Pre-Paid Internet Service **PCs for People**

- Service costs \$15/month, plus \$80 modem
- Eligibility: Households with income below the 200% poverty level, or currently enrolled in an incomebased government assistance program are eligible.
- Apply: Call 651-354-2552 or apply online at pcsrefurbished.com

#### Human I-T

- Service costs \$15/month, plus \$150 modem
- Eligibility: Households with income below the 200% poverty level, or currently enrolled in an incomebased government assistance program are eligible.
- **Apply**: Call (888) 268-3921, text 562-372-6925, or apply online at hitconnect.org

## Free Public Wi-fi Hotspots

- Public Comcast and AT&T Wi-Fi hotspots are available throughout the city.
- Wi-Fi access at all Philadelphia Library locations will remain active even while branches are closed. An active library card number and PIN are needed to access the location's Wi-Fi.
- Wi-Fi access at all School District schools will remain active for students even while schools are closed.
